tarting a new brand is never easy.
A strong marketing campaign to support the launch is always a good idea, and there's value in providing clues along the way to stoke interest and generate enthusiasm.

Still, building brand equity, especially at the outset, can have unintended consequences. When we set out to publish *Detroit 500*, our goal was to produce an annual resource guide of the most powerful executives in metro Detroit, and, in some cases, around the state.

On that front, mission accomplished. The criterion was straightforward: Research the largest companies, identify the top leaders, arrange the executives into specific business categories, and profile the secrets to their success.

As we delved deeper, "powerful" became an overarching theme. Many of the people profiled on the following pages oversee large corporations that generate billions of dollars in annual revenue, employ thousands of people, and produce products or services that reach nearly every country or region in the world.

But power comes in many forms. The oft-stated principle that, on average, there are six degrees of separation between any given person and the pope was one of our guiding doctrines. When confronted with a major problem, knowing that key person in a business or an organization can lead to amazing results.

Consider the case of Mike and Marian Ilitch, who years ago traveled with another couple to Rome for a vacation. Upon their arrival, their male traveling companion realized he had mistakenly brought his daughter's passport rather than his own. From that point, he was placed in confinement until the matter could be resolved.

Unable to appeal to the local authorities for relief, Mike called his longtime friend, Frank Stella, owner of a restaurant kitchen supply business on Detroit's west side that had helped Little Caesars set up its first 200 pizza restaurants.

Stella, who ran a successful company that served the regional marketplace, didn't run the largest enterprise in the world, but he was an icon in the Italian community, and a close friend of Pope John Paul II. After Ilitch described the problem, Stella commented that although it was

late at night, but he would make a call.

As Stella explained the issue to the Pope's secretary, there was a click on the line and then a voice. "Frank, is that you?" Within an hour, the Swiss Guard arrived at the airport, Ilitch's friend was released, and the vacation was back on track.

For every fork in the road, it always pays to have access to wise counsel. And that's the spirit of *Detroit 500*. This first-of-its-kind publication is the ultimate resource guide for navigating a city and state that's home to some of the world's largest corporations, a vast array of middlemarket companies, and thousands upon thousands of small businesses.

Standing out and making a mark amid the sheer number of enterprises is a challenge, but the more people you know, the chances for success are that much greater.

Now, about those unintended consequences: After we launched a series of print and digital ads to support the debut of *Detroit 500*, we had some interesting feedback.

Quite a few people thought we were hosting an auto race — where, I'm not sure. We heard from event planners, florists, restaurants, tire suppliers, and one woman who volunteered to wave the checkered flag. While we're not hosting a race, if we ever did, *Detroit 500* is where we would start.


